




A Tribute to Lion Toshi Nishioka

On March 3, 2021, we lost our beloved Charter Member Lion Toshio Nishioka at the age of 92. "Toshi" as everyone knew him, was a kind, humble, and compassionate individual who exemplified the true meaning of Lionism as he was also very determined and committed.

Toshi was born and raised on the Valley Isle of Maui in old Wailuku Town and attended Baldwin High School. His island upbringing taught him the values of hard work, "ganbatte" (always trying his best), giving back to his community, and respecting others.

Toshi worked for the State of Hawaii Department of Social Services and Housing and rose to the position of Administrator of the Vocational Rehabilitation and Services for the Blind Division. He ably directed this division to provide rehabilitation services to assist eligible disabled persons find employment and assist visually handicapped persons to lead full and independent lives. One of his responsibilities included overseeing Ho'opono Services for the Blind, which is a beneficiary of the Hawaii Lions. Toshi retired from his position in 1990.

It was on April 9, 1973 that Toshi and a group of service-minded individuals met at Wo Fat Restaurant in Downtown Honolulu and chartered the Hawaii Kai Lions Club. These Lions took to heart the advice of Melvin Jones, the founder of Lions Clubs International who said, "You can't get very far until you start doing something for someone else...". And take to heart they did, building a club that is fifty-six members strong today, and widely respected as one of the best clubs in Hawaii.

As a Lion, Toshi was totally committed to the Lions motto "To Serve", leading the club in giving back to the community through numerous service projects. He served in various club, zone, and district positions including Club President in 1980-1981. From 1991 to 1993 he also served as President of The Hawaii Lions Foundation, which promoted services to hearing and visually impaired individuals. An integral part of the Foundation was its Eye-Bank Program which provides ocular tissue for transplants.

Always committed, Toshi made sure that the Club had sufficient funds to fund all of its many projects. Perseverance made him a consistent top seller of pancake breakfast tickets for the Hawaii Kai Lions Club Fathers' Day Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser. A few years ago, Toshi suffered a heart attack requiring major open-heart surgery. A few weeks after surgery, not to be deterred, Toshi was back pounding the streets of his neighborhood on Sunday mornings and late weekday afternoons. When told he should take it easy, his reply was, "But my clients are all waiting for me!" "Inspirational" is the only comment one can make!

Together with his life-long companion, Companion in Service (CIS) Florence, they both diligently served their community to the fullest extent. Also, together they were able to travel to countries around the world via cruises and tours. Vegas was of course always on their travel itinerary along with Alaskan salmon fishing. Toshi was also an ardent "green-thumb" and loved raising orchids and fruit trees. He was an active member of the Hawaii Kai Orchid Society. Also, many of you may be surprised to know that Toshi enjoyed carpentry work and was a skilled craftsman. He even remodeled his home basement so he could provide storage for the many boxes of eyeglasses collected by our Lions Club.

Toshi is survived by wife Florence; son Lance and daughter LuAnn (Ryan) Takamori; 3 grandchildren and sister Mildred "Aiko" Goya. Services are pending.

Aloha Lion Toshi! You will certainly be missed!
