This Auction site had all the facilities to conduct an online auction, including setting up the databases for items, donors and bidders and to present final reports. The auction ran from November 8 to November 21, and yielded a total of \$212 to the Club Activities Fund.

A total number of 12 club members donated items for the auction, and a total of 64 items were donated. There were 15 bidders out of which there were 8 winning bidders in total. The primary concern for both the school and the Lions was safety. Donned with face masks, gloves and face shields, testing was completed in a little over an hour. Unable to use our S-12 machine that requires a 3 ft distance, testing was done with the Sloan chart outside the classrooms. Occluders were small sheets of paper handled by the students and were disposed on their way back to their seats with no unnecessary sanitizing. There were no lines and the only movement were the individual students coming out and going back to their rooms.

# "Easy Green Papaya lentil dal (soup)" Congratulations CIS Niru Submaranian

#### Ingredients:

- 1. One Raw green papaya seeded and peeled.
- 2.1 cup of red lentils
- 3. 1 large onion finely chopped
- 4.2 medium sized ripe tomatoes chopped.
- 5. 2 tsp of finely chopped or grated fresh ginger
- 6. 2 Serrano chillies finely chopped (adjust to taste)
- 7. 1 spring curry leaves (optional)
- 8. Half cup finely chopped cilantro
- 9. 1 tsp of curry powder (optional)
- 10. 1 tsp red chilli powder. (adjust to taste)
- 11. Salt to taste
- 12. 2 tbs olive oil or any cooking oil

#### Directions:

- 1. Cut papaya into small bite sized cubes and cook in boiling water (al dente). Drain water and set aside.
- 2. Pressure cook red lentils. (Can also cook on stove top with 3 to 4 cups of water). The dal should be mushy. Set aside
- 3. In a heavy pot heat 2 Tbs of oil on medium heat. Then add onions and salute for few minutes. Then add chopped green chilies and ginger. Sauté for a few seconds, add curry powder, red chili powder, curry leaves and chopped tomatoes. Cook till tomatoes are mushy. Add the cooked dal and cubed cooked papaya. Stir well, add salt to taste. Let this mixture come to a boil on medium heat. Add water if mix is too thick. Turn off heat. Taste and adjust salt and spiciness.

Transfer to serving bowl and top with cilantro. Can serve this over cooked rice or separately as soup with croutons and crushed pepper. Enjoy.
