On Saturday, April 24, Koko Head Elementary School paid tribute to former principal Cecelia “Cissy” Lum. The School’s Administration Building was named after her in bold lettering above its entrance door. Lion Ken Nishibun and CIS Sylvia Nakakura attended a ceremony (socially distanced) of family, staff and friends to commemorate this event. CIS Sylvia was closely involved in the planning and execution of the celebration.

Cissy Lum passed away on January 14, 2021. She served as Koko Head’s principal for 30 years retiring in 2010. Her devotion, praise, kindness, and positive, helpful spirit created a Ohana-centered atmosphere that became the key to the school’s success. She was instrumental in the school’s high academic standards thus paving the way for Koko Head’s U.S. Department of Education 2011 National Blue Ribbon School award.

During Miss Lum’s lengthy tenure at the school’s helm, many of our Lions and CISs knew her well and some had their children and grandchildren attend Koko Head.

The Hawaii Kai Lions and Koko Head School have always had a very close relationship. Throughout the years, a few of the Lions projects included building playground equipment, painting buildings, striping parking spaces, building a project work station, building a podium, and donating dozens of classroom fans, sports equipment, TVs and other electronic equipment.

Koko Head School was constructed in 1954 and is one of the oldest members of the Kaiser Complex, which includes Henry J. Kaiser High School, Niu Valley Middle School, Aina Haina Elementary, Hahaione Elementary and Kamiloiki Elementary.
