PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The first Going Green Recycling Day after a four-month hiatus due to COVID-19 was held at Pu'uhale Elementary School on August 1 from 9:00-11:00am. This was a trial to confirm that the event could be conducted safely. It was not clear if we would even be allowed to move forward with the event until two days before it was scheduled because of the spike in new infections. The event was deemed a success although it's not clear if this recycling project can continue in the short term due new restrictions that will go into effect shortly.

A total of 29 volunteers from seven Lions clubs participated in the event, which was organized by the Hawaii Cyber Lions. The following Hawaii Kai Lions participated: Ellsworth Fujii, David Iwana, Allen Umeda and CIS Fumiko.

A total of 3 truckloads of e-waste was collected, along with batteries, clothing, eyeglasses and hearing aids.

We are monitoring the situation at Maunalua Bay and will plan a Going Green Day at this location when it is safe to do so and the city and state start issuing permits for use of the area.

On Friday, August 14, 2020, the Storage Container hui (Lions Eric Kvick, Appan Subramanian, Ken Nishibun, Marty Jorgensen and David Iwana) met with Kaiser High School Vice Principal Dana Takahara-Dias and Facilities Manager Reggie Foo, to inspect a proposed storage container on the campus. It has been hoped and proposed by the committee that we use the 20' container to relocate and store all of the Father's Day Pancake Breakfast equipment and supplies, currently housed in the Hawaii Candy Company near the airport.

After discussions with Kaiser during the year and following the inspection of the unit, it was formally offered to the Hawaii Kai Lions to use! For years, Hawaii Candy has allowed us to store our materials and it is greatly appreciated, however, by using the Kaiser container, it will not only be more convenient for equipment storage, but avoid work interruptions at Hawaii Candy. There may be some modifications needed to the container, however, moving day is expected within the next few months.
