We started with a short OAE training session by PDG Shannon Ching. Lions were assigned Otoscope, Recorder, OAE testers, Audio, Traffic Controller, Registration and Form Collection responsibilities and everyone did an awesome job at what they were doing. Traffic flowed very smoothly, background noise and distraction were kept to a minimum by our traffic controllers. The hearing screening of 153 students was completed in about 1 1/2 hours including a wait of 15 minutes for their recess. There were no major problems even after a 2 year hiatus and several new hearing screening volunteers.
