
The Melvin Jones Fellow is one of the Lions Clubs International Foundation's highest recognitions, honoring the commitment of its members to humanitarian service to those in need around the world. Some of these services include providing disaster relief, saving sight for millions of people, supporting youth and combating disability. The Hawaii Kai Lions Club is extremely proud of its history with the Foundation. We currently have 31 active Melvin Jones Fellows or Progressive Fellows which represents one of the highest percentages of any club in the State of Hawaii.

Today, the Hawaii Kai Lions Club is proud to announce that it has selected Past District Governor Lion Roy Aoki as its 2022-2023 Melvin Jones Fellow honoree; as such, the Club has donated \$1,000 to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) in his name.



Kalele Kai Condominium Directions For Club Meetings

In-person meetings will be held at 1 Keahole Place, Hawaii Kai. (Kalele Kai Condominiums). Please arrive between 6:45 PM and 7.00 PM. Someone will be at the Main entrance "IN" to open the gate.
